CABINETS

- Natural wood cabinets (especially maple and cherry) will darken over time, much of which will occur in the first six months.
- Part of the natural beauty of wood is that there may be great variations in wood characteristics between doors. The extent of this variation will depend on the wood species.
- Designing with semi-custom cabinetry may result in some areas of the cabinets being inaccessible – these are called “Dead Spaces.”
- Although solid wood may be used for the doors and exterior panels of your cabinets, other materials may be used in the construction of your cabinets. Most manufactured cabinets will be constructed with MDF or laminate materials for some features.
- When installing cabinetry, nails are used in certain places. Putty will be used to fill those indentations, which will then be covered with stain.
- Door hardware may become loose over time and can easily be corrected with a screwdriver.
